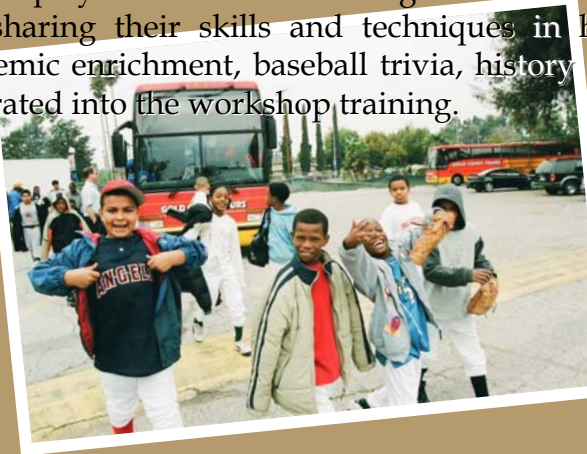

**2008 SUMMER WORKSHOP with
CRENSHAW HIGH SCHOOL**

The Los Angeles Urban League & The Remembering When Foundation are sponsoring a Summer Workshop with members of the Crenshaw High School baseball community. For 6 weeks, student athletes will engage in baseball training and an academic enrichment program designed to increase literacy skills. Students will be visited by former MLB & Negro League players and take educational fieldtrips exposing them to mentorship/internship opportunities.

WORKSHOPS

Free youth baseball workshops are held throughout the year at participating elementary and secondary schools and span two to three days per week. The Foundation works in conjunction with baseball coaches to create a plan of action to best support their teams. Former players from both the Negro Baseball Leagues and Major League Baseball spend the day sharing their skills and techniques in hitting, pitching, catching and base running. Academic enrichment, baseball trivia, history of the game and certificates of completion are integrated into the workshop training.
